Principal's Message- Mrs. Do

1. Staff conducting development and meetings to standardize how student success is communicated to parents

- a. Emphasis on assessment across a grade team being consistent with one another
- b. Data and information about how child is doing in content areas in addition to socially/emotionally
- c. If parents have concerns please raise them with teachers and ask directly about areas of concern (ex. "how is my child doing in math")
- d. Building partnership with parents
- 2. Jog-a-Thon, thank you!
 - a. If the \$35k goal is reached there will be a school-wide assembly to spray down Ms. Hansen and Do with ketchup and mustard. \$18,000 half-way prize as well.
- 3. Field/Fence Update
 - a. District is in charge of all aspects of the project and has communicated that the contractor is behind.
 - b. Gates will be put up and final walk through will occur later than projected

4. Clubs

- a. Clubs are an excellent way to provide more enrichment opportunities and students are very enthusiastic about club opportunities
- b. Volunteers needed. Must meet ratio 1:10
- c. There is opportunity for club time to be hosted during student lunch. Library location is available and simple ideas encouraged e.g. crafting, board games, chess etc. Provides more opportunity for those students who are unable to stay for after school clubs
- d. Girls' running club is ready to go. Appeal for additional clubs.
- 5. November conferences
 - a. Conferences will be held Tues. Nov 6th evening and Nov. 7t -8.
 - b. This means students will attend school Monday & Tuesday, and will be OFF Wednesday-Friday

- 6. Beginning of year emphasis on revisiting, reteaching, reinforcing school expectations
- 7. Emergency Drills
 - a. Scheduled to occur 1x per month, generally will not be told there is a drill ahead of time
 - b. September had 2 drills: a fire drill and a secure drill. This past week they also had a bus safety/evacuation drill.
 - c. Throughout the school year, if a non-drill emergency occurs staff will communicate with families and provide as much information as possible

 - The 153rd/Forest Ave corner is wonky
 - Temporary solution is thePark and Walk established in 22/23 with Oak Hills Church
 - District is working with county to redesign the Forest/153rd "triangle"/island to be safer, infrastructure takes a long time though
 - Walking school bus (more info here)
 - Working to launch a walking school bus for Oak Hills
 - Set to launch on Walk & Roll to School (Oct 4) and be offered weekly
 - Looking for volunteers and student participants
 - o International Walk & Roll to School Day is Wed. Oct 4
 - Scooter, helmet, some other prizes to give away
 - Extra prizes for students participating in walking school bus
